7/... From rhetoric to reality: a global call for concrete action against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance

The Human Rights Council,

Reaffirming all the previous resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly, the Human Rights Council and the Commission on Human Rights and the Human Rights Council on the elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance,

Convinced that lack of political will remains the core factor in the failure by States to translate the commitments of the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action into concrete action and tangible results, in particular with respect to honouring the memory of the victims of historic injustices and past tragedies caused by slavery, the slave trade, the transatlantic slave trade, apartheid, colonialism and genocide, and also underlining that Africans and people of African descent, Asians and people of Asian descent and indigenous peoples were victims of these injustices and tragedies and continue to be victims of their consequences,

Noting some positive developments in the fight against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance,

1. Regrets the persisting lack of political will to take decisive steps to combat racism in all its forms and manifestations and to concretely move away from denials about the persistence of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance;

Salutes all positive developments in the fight against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance;

- 2. Welcomes the landmark and historic formal apology by the Government of Australia for the past laws and policies that inflicted profound grief, suffering and loss on its aboriginal indigenous peoples;
- 3. Urges Governments that have not done so to issue formal apologies to the victims of past and historic injustices and to take all necessary measures to achieve healing and reconciliation and restoring the dignity of these victims, as outlined in paragraph 101 of the DDPA;
- 3. Bis Regrets the persisting lack of political will to take decisive steps to combat racism in all its forms and manifestations and to concretely move away from denials about the persistence of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance (former OP 1)
- 3 Bis *Urges* all governments to summon the necessary political will to take decisive steps to combat racism in all its forms and manifestations;
- 4. Endorses Acknowledges the report of the Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent on its eighth session;
- 5. Welcomes the convening of the first part of the sixth session of the Intergovernmental Working Group on the Effective Implementation of the Durban Declaration and Programme of

Action in January 2008, during which the Working Group made an initial contribution to the preparatory process of the Durban Review Conference, and looks forward to the convening of the second part of the sixth session, during which the Working Group should continue its follow-up to the implementation of the DDPA, including the relevant paragraphs of the DDPA which are yet to receive the necessary attention, in accordance with the Working Group's programme of work; and requests it to continue to provide guidance to the Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent;

- 6. Also welcomes the convening of the first part of the first session of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Elaboration of Complementary Standards in February 2008, and requests the Ad Hoc Committee, at the second part of its first session, to fulfil heed, as a matter of priority, the mandate entrusted to it via Human Rights Council decision 3/103 and Human Rights Council resolution 6/21 the instruction and decision of the 2001 World Conference against Racism, Racial Discrimination, Xenophobia and Related Intolerance to prepare complementary international standards to strengthen and update international instruments against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance in all their aspects;
- 7. Further welcomes Acknowledges the report of the Special Rapporteur on contemporary forms of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance to the seventh session of the Human Rights Council;<sup>2</sup>
- 8. Decides to invite the **Group of** Five Independent Eminent Experts to address the Council at its tenth session;
