To President,

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The LEBANESE Government announced from the first instance when the events broke that it had no prior knowledge of what happened nor did it endorse the operation carried out by Hezbollah.

Furthermore, the Prime Minister called for an immediate and comprehensive cease fire under the UN auspices which will enable to responsibly resolve all issues arising from the events as well as their underlying causes.

That did not stop the aggression from escalating.  
What we are facing , as The  
Prime Minister of Lebanon  
Tammam Saliba said, goes  
beyond the issue of prisoners  
and captured soldiers. It is a  
whole nation whose people's  
rights, security and land are  
being trampled under a questionable  
pretext.

Today Lebanon as a nation is  
aggressed and the fundamental  
rights of its citizens transgressed by  
Israel .

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Let me, Sir, illustrate some of  
these rights in particular under  
the Universal Declaration of Human  
Rights, The Two International Covenants  
on Human Rights, and The Convention  
on the Rights of the Child.

- The right of life: The Israelis  
kill civilian Lebanese, they commit  
massacres, mass murders, while this  
right is acknowledged non-derogable and  
applicable in time of armed conflict  
according to article 4 of the International  
Covenant on Civil and Political Rights
- The right to protection: disregarded  
and ignored
- The right of not being subjected to  
cruel or degrading treatment or  
punishment: Lebanese are collectively  
slaughtered and punished by Israelis.

- The right of survival and development of the Child to be protected from all forms of Physical or mental violence, in particular the rights of mentally or physically disabled children: On 30 July 2006 The Israeli's murdered 62 civilians in Gaza amongst them 42 children of whom 15 were disabled.

"Gaza is not a stranger to tragedy as Kofi Annan said in his letter dated 7 August 2006 to the President of the Security Council; he added: "Ten years ago, on 18 April 1996, more than 100 Lebanese civilians who had sought refuge in a UNRWA compound located in Gaza were killed as a result of shelling by the Israeli Defence Forces". It is indeed a dangerous recurrence most punishable in law. None of the bodies recovered showed that there were militant mingled among

civilian. To cover up this <sup>(7)</sup> heinous crime, the Israelis invoke the theory of "human shields", which, under any circumstances does not release the Parties to the conflict from their obligations under International Humanitarian Law, with respect to the civilian population and civilians! The giant Israeli ostrich cannot any more hide its head in the sand and claim innocence!

Whether children or adults, the killing is perpetrated in a most ruthless way, as in Qazieh - north of Sidon, where six civilians were killed by an Israeli airstrike during <sup>the</sup> funerals of 14 victims. As usual, and when in dire trouble, the Israelis are either

alleged

apologetic for unintended error or, as convenient, they invoke the theory of "human shield"

I can elaborate, Mr President,

by mentioning:

- The right to adequate housing,  
and our houses are destroyed.
- The right to food, there is a  
shortage of food due to an Israeli blockade  
and bridges, highways and roads cut off.
- The right to highest attainable standard  
of health, and our hospitals are in particular  
peril due to fuel shortage.
- The right to education, while  
schools are either destroyed or sheltering,  
one million internally displaced  
persons, accommodated as well in  
other facilities. (~~and~~) the camps

Indeed Lebanon, is on the brink  
of a humanitarian disaster, as  
David Shearer, UN humanitarian

coordinator for Lebanon said on (9) August 7, 2006, a serious matter which will keep the UN rapporteurs as well as the International Courts busy for quite some time in the future.

Amid this persistent Israeli aggression, aimed at destroying the whole state of Lebanon, and the disproportionate use of force, it is most regretful that some colleagues continue to argue about "balance" or to question the competence of this Council in case of gross and systematic violations of human rights.

The whole draft resolution before you addresses the Israeli violations of human rights in Lebanon. It is not

The Secretary General's request  
contained in his statement to

The Security Council on 30 July  
2006 and I quote: "we must  
condemn this action in the
