Your Excellency;

Upon my return to the United States from my last visit with you, I discussed with my colleagues the contents of our meeting regarding the U.N. humanitarian package and Iraq's sanction situation. I was advised to prepare a white paper to the Secretary General expressing your concerns and to simultaneously engage a reputable Attorney of high standards with strong ties to the current U.S. Administration as well as to the U.N. to prepare a resolution that will find no objection from the U.S. and along the frame mind of the U.N.

A meeting was scheduled with the Secretary General in March 22, 1993 to discuss the white paper (enclosed) as well as to review your concerns and recommendations. Enclosed you find the comments the Secretary General had made prior to my engaging the Attorney, Mr Ted Sorensen, for whom the Secretary General has high regards. Enclosed you also find Mr Sorensen's resume.

I therefore enclose for you serious considerations Mr Sorensen's thoughts and recommendations which he had researched and discreetly investigated with both the U.N. and the U.S. administration re merits and probabilities.

It is my feeling and those of my associates including Mr Sorensen and the Secretary General that Iraq has to implement this kind of humanitarian Aid to show the world body the goodwill it has toward its people and its readiness to rejoin the league of Nations. We feel in a very short time thereafter total economic sanctions will be lifted. We also feel that barring this move will cause Iraq to suffer sanctions for some time to come.
